


# Palliative Suite Project

Some major transformations have been happening in our home. Several major construction projects are underway under the direction of our Maintenance Manager Harry Searle. Some days it feels like something is happening in just about every corner, but we are doing our utmost to make sure Residents feel at home.

#### Phase One of our Palliative Suite Project

#### Phase II of the Palliative Suite Project

We closed the former entrance at 10 Parks Street and converted receptionist Kim Gaudet's office space back into a bedroom which will become the new palliative suite.









### **Phase III Atrium Project**

The final step will be to renovate the former Lobby/Entrance at 10 Parks Street and transform it into a beautiful Atrium and Visiting Space. Foundation Executive Director Sally Cummings envisions a relaxing area where families and residents can spend time, away from the hustle and bustle of daily operations of the home. . "We will need to install lighting and furnishings, and hope to have a waterwall feature, and fire place. The price tag for Snoezalyn equipment is \$15,000 alone, so fundraising for the Palliative Suite Project will continue as long as it takes, says Cummings.





The Foundation will give meaningful purpose to an underutilized space once again.

Residents will be able to play with these sensory stimulation items through touch and feel. These features are calming and interactive. "The Atrium will be available for visitors when a loved one is palliative, but will also serve as a relaxing space for residents and families to gather anytime," says Cummings.

## Rocmaura Sprinkler Project

Meanwhile Rocmaura Inc. continues on a major Sprinkler Project which got underway on Garden Court in mid-April. The entire sprinkler system is being replaced by the Province of New Brunswick, (with the exception of Trinity Court.) This has been on the list of needed upgrades for many years, and has finally come to fruition. The contractors, Flood Construction and Viking Sprinkler, are working on a group of twelve rooms at a time.

Acting Executive Director Theresa Mercer says with a project as large and challenging as this, we have been preparing plans to accommodate the residents and staff during the expected 14 month duration project, with a target finish date of June, 2024.

"Most residents will be temporarily moved for about four to five weeks, however Resident care, comfort and safety remain our primary concern," says Mercer. Families will communicate directly with the RN in charge on their Court.



## How to Help?

One of the most helpful things is to remove excess and seasonal items/clothing from resident rooms. Please take any valuables and breakables home. Being here with your resident when their moves are happening is also helpful and calming for your loved one.





## A FAMILY STORY

Julie Rioux is visiting her Father Roy McLaughlin and enjoying the entertainment on Garden Court. Back in the day, his wife was quite famous in Saint John.

Roy married Edith Mae, who was one of the first quadruplets born in Canada. The famous Mahaney babies were born at home in 1923 on Christmas day. Their arrival was a Christmas miracle! (This was just over a decade prior to the Dionne quintuplets being born in Ontario in 1934.) Fertility drugs were uncommon in those days, so it was considered pretty special.

The Mahaney family were featured in numerous newspaper articles and even a book.





Julie says her Mother's parents weren't expecting quadruplets; they thought they might be having twins. They already had five children when the Quads came along. Her Mother was one of eleven who grew up on St. James street. She says the City was very supportive of the Quads. The community helped the family in hard times, pledging not to let them lose their home. Julie says her mother spoke fondly of having a normal, happy childhood, however they were a bit of a curiosity.



Growing up in the 1920's and 30's, the Quads received a lot of attention, but Julie says it didn't go to their heads. "My mother grew up kind-hearted, and she would give you the shirt off her back." She remembers her Mother saying that her father didn't want them to be in a circus atmosphere and refused to allow the children to become wards of the government. She thought they might form a vaudeville act someday when they grew up.

Their childhood years were described as being in a bit of a fishbowl. The Quads appeared at fairs and car shows in New Brunswick, Maine, and Nova Scotia, including the Saint John Exhibition, in which they made \$700 at the gate, which was split with the promoter. Their photos were featured on milk bottles and articles every year leading up to Christmas.



In 1939, they turned down an invitation to go on display at the Chicago World's Fair. The Dionne Quints had been offered \$50,000 for their appearance too, but their doctor would not let them go. That same year, the Quads met the late King George VI and Queen Mother Elizabeth during a Royal visit to Canada, and every year, King George V sent them gifts.

By 1944 to 1947, the Quads all had married and enjoyed the obscurity of adulthood. Julie says her mother liked to dance and sometimes play cards. The quads kept in touch in their older years, but never got together. Edith Mae Mahaney McLaughlin died in October 2003 at the age of 79, twenty years ago. Roy has resided at Rocmaura since the fall of 2019. He worked at the Port. Julie and her husband are retired and enjoy visiting Rocmaura. Thank you for sharing your wonderful story!
